President Maureen Lyons called the meeting to order at 4:30pm

JANUARY 26, 2016 MINUTES: The minutes of the January 26 meeting were approved as written.

JANUARY OPERATING BILLS: The Alliant bill is for two months due to a change in the billing cycle. It was moved and seconded (Thoreson/Thiessen) to approve the bills. The motion was unanimously approved.

OLD BUSINESS:

--Library staff and Board members have been looking over the current circulation policy. Some possible changes include: raising the maximum fine from \$3.00 to \$5.00 and having an "introductory period" for new users, during which they are allowed to check out a limited number of items. Staff members are still working on this policy and it will be presented again before approval.

NEW BUSINESS:

--City Budget: The final budget hearing is March 7 at noon in the City Council Chambers. Much of the new levy money has been allocated to staff: making our Volunteer Coordinator a permanent part-time position of 20 hours/week, choosing a Sunday Supervisor, hiring extra staff to cover Sunday hours and the possibility of a building monitor. Levy funds will also be used for materials, building maintenance, technology and programming.

DIRECTOR'S REPORT:

- --FOL Updates: The recent cookbook sale raised nearly \$1400 and the Modern Woodmen of America presented the Friends with a \$500 donation. The Friends purchased a new display rack that will feature particular selections of books for sale and also two new book carts. The Friends voted to use funds from a bequest to purchase five new computers. It is hoped that the levy funds will allow us to replace computers and other technology on a rotating basis.
- --Wondering if Emerson has a source or facility to recycle or reclaim equipment and materials.
- --AARP Tax Help: Volunteers continue to offer tax preparation assistance to seniors and low income folks. The library has a limited number of IRS forms, but can print out forms we do not carry and any lowa State form.
