D: Director's Report:

--It is important to remember that the Friends of the Library is funding the building renovation project and the MOBI "garage." FOL funds are used to ENHANCE library services but do not cover operating expenses, salaries or maintenance.

--The city recently completed a compensation study and the City Council will be voting on that soon.

--The Chamber of Commerce will host a candidate forum at the library on Tuesday, October 31 at 5:30. At-large and Ward 2 candidates will be present. The library will be a polling place for the city election on Tuesday, November 7.
